Meet seven more up-and-coming NYC dealers

## Joe Amrhein

In four years, Amrhein's gallery, Pierog 2000, has amassed 50 file drawers full of prints, drawings and photographs of 520 artists. Now, curators use the files to get a jump on new talent. Don a pair of white gloves and hold the actual artwork in your hands. Price range: \$50-\$2,000.

## Derek Eiler

This 30-year-old has, in just three seasons, proved a reliable source of what young collectors like: works on paper by interesting artists. There are punctuation-mark drawings by Marsha Cottrell, computer-generated drawings by Tom Moody and, this month, the photographs of Diana Kingsley. Price range: \$200-\$10,000.

## Rupert Goldsworthy

The Brit Goldsworthy stocks his closet-sized gallery with provocative work. The deadpan narratives by Glaswegian video artist Alan Currall and drawings by punk-Everyman Richard Hell are just a couple of things you won't find anywhere else. Price range: \$700-\$30,000.

## Carol Greene

Greene's large Chelsea gallery seems like the most established of this lot. More impressive than the space, however, is what she shows: Look for Jonathan Horowitz's conceptual videos, Jacqueline Humphries's abstract paintings and, next month, a collective of German artists called "Snowflake Office." Price range: \$500-\$25,000.

## Casey Kaplan

When this 29-year-old gallerist opened in '95, he immediately started luring emerging young artists from such far-flung places as L.A., Berlin and

London (including photographer Annika van Hauswolf, who represented Sweden in this year's Venice Biennale). Up this month: an installation by British artist Jonathan Monk. Stop in for details.

## Andrew Kreps

Kreps has stocked his gallery with some of NYC's freshest work, including whimsical oil paintings by Ruth Root (who also makes small, affordable drawings), bottle-cap paintings by Robert Melee and the fabric creations of Meredith Danluck. Price range: \$400-\$8,000.

## Bill Maynes

Here you'll find work by mid-career as well as emerging artists, such as oils by painter Guy Goodwin, drawings of explosive events (a sneeze, a geyser) by Heide Fasnacht and the gutsy narrative drawings by Chicago artist Tony Fitzpatrick. This month: the sculpture of Lewis DeSoto. Price range: \$400-\$15,000.
